1972 HOBIE CAT NATIONALS

The highlight of the 1972 Hobie Cat racing season will be the Hobie Cat Nationals. This year the Hobie Cat 14 and Hobie Cat 16 Nationals will be held concurrently at the same site during October 13-22, 1972. This way these skippers wishing to participate in only the 14 or the 16 Nationals may come for those races; skippers wishing to race in both Nationals may now do so with a minimum of travel expense and time away from work.

The site for this years event is Surfside, Texas, a private beach community located about sixty miles south of Houston and just north of Freeport. It has a long beach with lots of privately owned beach houses we have arranged to rent. These houses are built on stilts and offer an excellent view of everything. You can camp right on the beach or among the houses. There is plenty of beach for boat storage and the racing activity will take place right off shore so everyone can watch the activities. Needless to say there will be lots of parties and activities throughout the regattas.

Among the reasons Surfside was chosen as this years site is it's central location. It is only 1,550 miles from Los Angeles, 1,200 miles from Miami, 1,900 from Boston and San Francisco, 1,300 from Detroit, 1,200 from Minneapolis and 2,300 from Seattle. Houston is reached by several major highways so it should be an easy drive from most everywhere.

We feel we have found just the spot for which we have spent so many months searching. We will release full details on activities, accommodations and travel suggestions in the near future. Meanwhile, start making your plans for the greatest racing vacation of your life.

HOBIE CAT 14 BATTENS

We have redesigned the Hobie Cat 14 battens in conjunction with the new Class Racing Rules. These new battens are quite a bit stiffer, much more durable and are taperable (the new Class Rules allow you to taper the Hobie 14 battens). They will allow you a lot of latitude in sail shape.

Because we feel the new batters are an advantage for the racing skipper, we have worked out a special price for a limited time. The normal retail price for a set of Hobie 14 battens is 33.00 plus freight. If your order between now and August 1, 1972, you can purchase a full set of already tapered battens for 20.00 plus \$5.00 shipping and handling. You can either order through your local dealer (who should have a supply in stock the first part of July) or mail your order (and money-25.00 total) directly to Coast Catamaran. Remember, this special offer definitely expires August 1, 1972 so place your order early. Specify part number 1101-N.

The racing divisions are by no means meant to confine your activity to a given area. They only serve to aid us in evaluating activity and diseminating information to areas involved. You are more than welcome to compete in regattas outside your division.



THINGS TO DO AND THINGS NOT TO DO AT A HOBIE CAT REGATTA

Many skippers who come to a race are confused about what they should do on and off the race course. There are many things which can make the race committee's life a lot easier and the event more enjoyable for everyone. Here is a list of what we feel should be kept in mind when you attend a Hobie Cat regatta:

- 1. Be sure to register before the race. This is important as registration not only tells us who is attending the event, but from where. The registration fee also serves as a revenue to help offset the cost of trophies and any other goodies which might be given away at the regatta.
- 2. Be sure your fleet pennant is located in the proper place and is the proper color. If you are sailing in a regatta where either the 14's or 16's are broken into an A, B or C fleet. The A fleet should have a red pennant flying from the boom, the B fleet should have a green pennant from the lowest batten, the C fleet needs no pennant as the absence of the pennant indicates the fleet.
- 3. Stay clear of the starting area until it is your turn to start. It is very easy for a skipper to foul up the start of another fleet if he is in the wrong place when they are trying to start. Try to be very conscious of time and who's starting and be sure you are well away from the starting line and the staging area, at least a minute before the start.
- 4. Do not sail through the start-finish line unless you are starting or finishing. This is extremely important as the race committee has no way of knowing who has sailed the complete course. If you sail through the line during the middle of the race, you will automatically be disqualified.
- 5. Don't ask the race committee questions like how much time is left or "How did I finish." They should not give out that information in the first place. It is your responsibility to keep track of time remaining before the start, what course you should be sailing and items like that. When you finish and ask the race committee how you did, you could distract them from a busy finish sequence and can cause them to miss a finisher. There is plenty of time when you get on shore to see how you did (if you can't simply count the number of boats in front of you).
- 6. Clear the finish line as soon as possible after you finish and stay well clear of the finish area while waiting for the next race to start. You can easily drift into the path of a boat about to finish and perhaps cost him a place or two.
- 7. If you are finishing on a broad reach or a downwind, remember to sheet in just as you cross the finish line so the race committee can read your sail number. It's almost impossible to read the sail number of a boat going downwind across the finish line. Try to keep in mind the race committee's job and make it as easy as possible for them to get your number in the correct position.
- 8. If you didn't hear a horn when you finish, or hear your sail number called, check with the race committee at the earliest convenience and be sure they have you marked down in the proper finishing sequence. It's helpful to make a mental note of the boat who finished just behind and just in front of you for future reference. Occasionally the finishing committee can miss a boat and the only way they know where he should be is by boats he finished between.
- 9. If you are going to protest a yacht, be sure you have notified that yacht of your intention to protest and fly a flag at the finish line. A "flag" does not include a life jacket, hat, jacket, shirt, ribbon or other such items. It should be a flag carried aboard expressly for the use of a protest flag. This is part of the sailing equipment and the race committee should not accept any less. I usually specify a 10 x 10 minimum flag shaped item.
- 10. If you are dropping out of a race, notify the race committee as soon as possible. Often times a race committee will spend many hours looking for a boat which is not finished only to find he went early and packed up and went home. Also, you will rereive a different score if you receive a DNF as opposed to a DNS. All our race instructions suggest the race committee give a DNF only to boats who advise them they are not finishing.

Always keep in mind that the race committee's job is to run a smooth regatta and provide as much fun as possible to the participants. These are only of a few of the ways you can help to make their job easier and consequently help make the regatta that much better.

MAINTAINANCE TIP

The sailing and racing season is just beginning and most boats have been removed from storage in anticipation of another exciting summer on the water. Here's a checklist which should help prolong your summer enjoyment by preventing possible part failures. We suggest you take a few minutes to go over your Hobie Cat and check these areas:

Wires: Check all shrouds and halyards for kinks or broken strands. Either can lead to a wire breakage. Chainplates Hobie 14 -Check the chainplates where they are riveted to the sidebar. Electrolysis can take place on boats used in salt water and the chainplate should be relocated an inch fore and aft every couple of years or the sidebar replaced if the electrolysis goes too far. (When relocating, spray sidebar and chainplate with WD-40 or other non-conducting protectant before installing. Use monel or heavy duty aluminum rivets.) Hobie 16 -Be sure your boat has the new anchor bar replacement kit (if your hull number is under 2100). This is a stamped stainless steel fitting that fits under the lip of the hull at the shroud connecting point. Contact your nearest dealer for this replacement part. Rudder System Rudder Pins: If your rudder pins are badly worn or distorted, you should replace them. Any nicks, deep scratches or cuts on the blade may result in failure. Rudder Blades: Consider carrying a spare blade in your car. Tiller Connections: Make sure your boat has the new tiller connecting system. If in doubt, check with your dealer. Tiller Extension: Inspect the swivel joint on the tiller extension. If the swivel is loose and sloppy, it should be replaced.

Rudder Gudgeons: Check for cracks around the sharp bends. These are subject to fatigue.

Trampoline Laces: Should be inspected for wear. It's a let-down when one breaks.

Keeper rings on the shroud adjusters should be replaced if distorted or worn. If you are leaving your boat rigged for a while, tape them so they can't work loose.

Teflon traveller and mast bearings should be replaced if badly worn. To replace the traveller car bearing, cut out the old one; warm the new one so it is pliable and slide it down over the car, pinching the sides together so they enter the track. Work the bearing down with a large screw-driver or similar.

If you have used your boat off a beach a lot, check the bottom for excessive wear.

Remember to tighten all shackles with pliers and always check to see that your drain plugs are in before shoving off.

A little preventive maintainance will assure you of maximum enjoyment of your Hobie Cat during your leisure time. We hope these tips help you have an active, trouble-free season.

HOBIE CAT WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

The scene is being set for the First Annual Hobie Cat World Championship Regatta tentatively scheduled for mid-January 1973 in Honolulu, Hawaii. We are planning to make this truly an international event with competitors coming from Europe, Australia, Mexico, Japan, Canada, United States and other miscellaneous areas. This will be strictly a qualified-skipper event which means only skippers who have qualified in their nation or region will be eligible to enter. We will limit the total number of entries to under fifty, taking approximately five from each major country. Details on the number of skippers who will be eligible from the United States and from each area of the world will be released at a later time. This will truly be the highlight of the Hobie Cat racing season and probably the best international event outside of the Olympics. We will release further details as plans progress.
