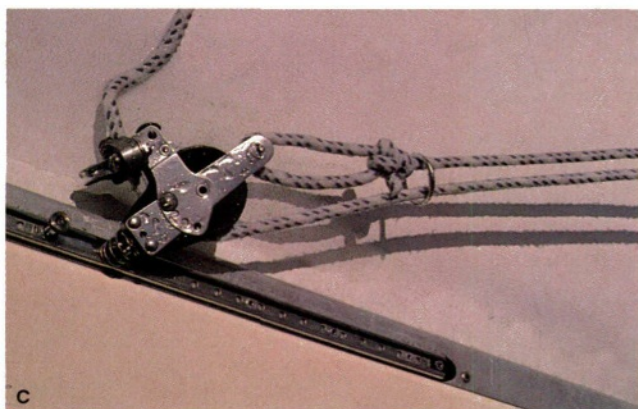

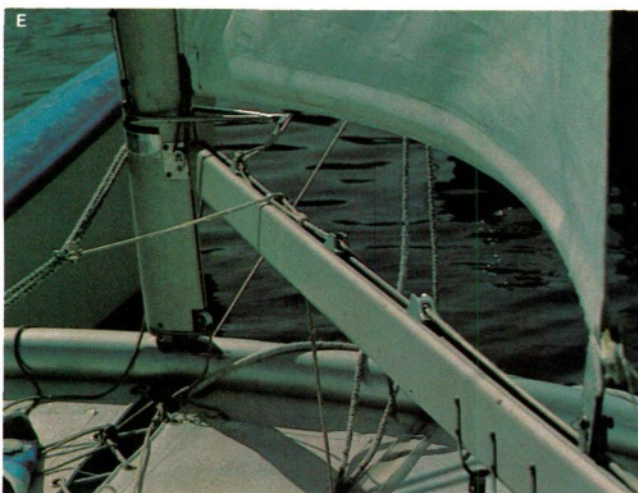
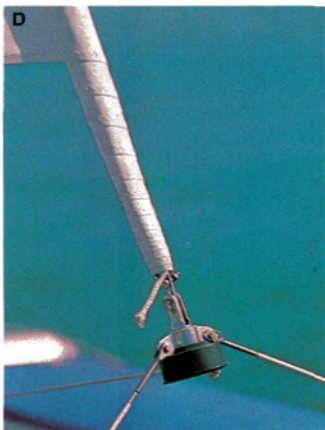

## Hobietorial: Speak Up

A longstanding topic of concern among both sailors and Coast Cat people has been the wrinkled appearance of the Hobie 14 sail. Even when well tuned, the sail shape is often inconsistent and less attractive than the neat tightness of the Hobie 16 sail. Expert sailmakers and sailors alike have been consulted and we feel a possible solution is at hand. Skip Elliott, a well-known sailmaker and successful catamaran racer, has designed a sample sail for the Hobie 14 which utilizes six battens (there are five in the present design), pocketed along the sail seams in the same manner as the Hobie 16 sail. Lookwise, the sail is prettier, and tuningwise, the sail shape can be more consistent.

Even though we feel the six batten sail would be a cosmetic improvement, we realize there are other factors to be considered. Hobie himself expresses his thoughts on the situation as follows:

*"We have long followed a tradition to hold down any radical, or particularly, costly changes which are against our policy or would upset our boat owners. In keeping with this practice, no changes will be made to the Hobie 14 sail unless we have a positive response from an overwhelming majority of boat owners. This is your chance to be heard—fill out the blank below and send it in to the Hot Line editor. Only with your input can we make a legitimate decision."*

*"If a change is approved by Hobie 14 users, the new six batten Hobie 14 sail will be available from dealers for a specified period of time at a substantial discount from regular price. Both the old and new type sails would be class legal—using the new design would of course not be mandatory. No six batten sails would be released until after the 1977 World Championships and the subsequent end of this year's racing season."*

*"Looking at it from the customer's viewpoint (and technically, I am a customer—both my sons have 14's, but I do admit to getting a 'good deal' from the factory), I can see two sides. It sure would be a great opportunity and a good deal pricewise to pick up on a new racing sail. I think my kids might save the new six batten sail for racing only to keep it clean and in top shape, and use their present sails for day sailing. And for anyone who's about ready to replace their sail anyway, the low introductory price on the six batten model would be especially convenient."*

*"On the other hand, the person who doesn't want or need a new sail may feel he has to get one to stay competitive. I doubt that the new design will be faster (the shape and sail area will be identical to the current style, and more battens don't equate to more speed), but theoretically, it should be minutely superior due to its consistent shape."*

But most significant of all, the youthful enthusiasm worthy of a teenager comes from a lean, tanned sexagenarian. Anyone who thinks that Hobie Catting, especially in the strong trade winds and heavy seas off the Virgin Islands, is for kids, should see this old-timer out on the wire screaming along on a reach. # Australian National Hobie Championships

Sailing took place on the Swan River in Perth. Hosting the competition was Nedlands Yacht Club, and a large food processing company, A.P.D. Ltd., generously sponsored the events.

Winning required fitness and coolness as two races were sailed in 35 mph winds, while the last two races saw only 3 mph breezes.

Western Australian Hobie 16 teams were faster than other Australian Hobies in all conditions and maintained a supremacy over the American competitors in heavier winds. Because local conditions generally offer reliable 20 mph winds, the Western Australian Hobies are rigged accordingly. Jerry King, visiting from California,

thought that it was not a difference in rigging that gave the West Aussies an edge but their sailing technique to windward. The top Hobie 16 team of Ager and Duechter weighed a total of 350 pounds and was never troubled by the heavier conditions. Their technique was to set their main traveller six inches out, their jib all the way out, and stay sheeted tight for power. In contrast, Ian and Kevin Allen needed to carry 15 pounds to bring them to the legal weight limit and used a different sailing technique, setting the main traveller at the toe straps and the jib all the way inboard. The jib was eased to the point where the main, sheeted block to block, was doing all the work. The ease with which

they handled the heavy weather in spite of their light weight awed all.

However, in light and medium breezes, the Americans showed their class. In three races Russ and Jerry established a winning lead, only to see the wind die completely and then lift boats on other parts of the course. Nevertheless, it was Russ, Jerry and Don with their radical (by local standards) ideas on boat rigging who injected great interest into the series. By the end of the series, all the top boats were rigged similarly and with much the same sail shape.

Kerli Corlett's win in the 14s was due to clever sailing. Kerli's full sail was contrary to local practice but successful. His tactical ability

and reading of windshifts were his greatest assets. Mal McKercher displayed great consistency, and he and Kevin Page used flat sails to great effect in heavier winds.

Next year's Nationals will be held in Victoria. Kevin (The Tank) King and Bill (Grey Ghost) Worrell will guide the organization. Conditions in Victoria are expected to be opposite to Western Australian conditions. No wind, muddy water, crook beer, skinny kangaroos and emus that don't fly are all characteristic of Victoria. Never mind! Western Australians will grin and bear it, especially when we have a title to defend.

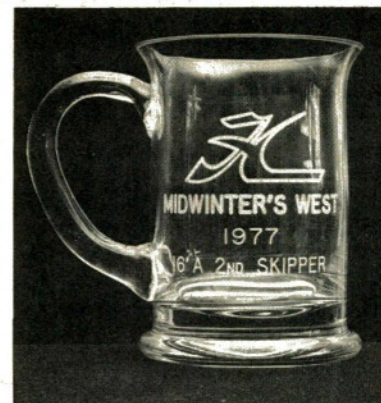

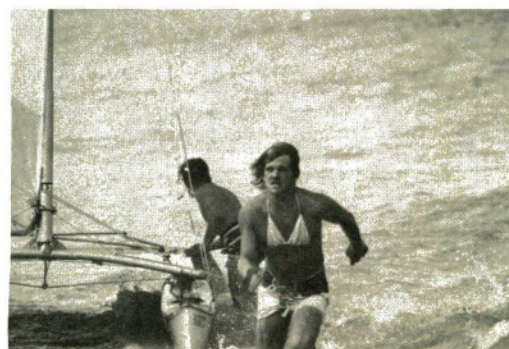
## REASONABLE FACSIMILES PREDOMINANT AT HAWAII REGATTA

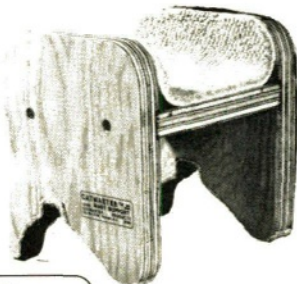

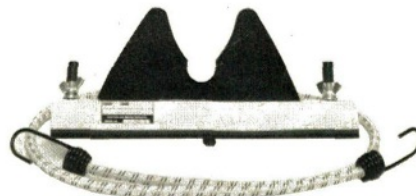

# REEFING: HOW TO CONTROL HOBIE POWER IN STIFF WINDS

Have you ever been caught on your favorite body of water when the wind picks up to a point where you can't handle that toy of yours anymore? That once controllable Hobie can turn into a bucking bronco. All you want to do is get safely and quickly back to the beach and put your boat away... but how?

The Hobie is designed with reefing points for an easy reduction of power, whether it be for a situation like the above or for taming things down when sailing with your family. Reefing is a means of reducing sail area by tying up part of the mainsail so that you do not harness as much wind. Here are some easy step-by-step instructions for reefing your Hobie. (You'll notice that the 14' sail is not designed for reefing; however, as with the other Hobies, you can travel the sail out and not sheet in as hard when caught in heavy wind conditions.)

No sailor should ever venture out into waters beyond the capabilities of his boat or his sailing skills. Even though the Hobie was designed to sail in most wind conditions, occasionally it can become too much to handle. From the beginning,

Hobie Alter's and the Hobie Class Association's goal was for you to have fun with your boat. Here's a quote from our original (1969) Hobie Sailing Manual:

"You can rely on your Hobie Cat as one of the safest small boats now available.

It is capable of enduring the roughest conditions. This confidence in your boat will give you endless pleasure, but we hope you will also heed the fact that Nature has many moods and her playgrounds can get quite rough without warning. So before venturing any distance from land, be sure you have practiced righting your boat and know your equipment is in good condition. Remember—in high winds and rough seas your boat is only as good as the skipper. Have Fun!"

## how to reef a hobie 10

1. Release the outhaul and downhaul lines.
2. Wrap the sail around the mast up to the first batten.
3. Attach the outhaul and downhaul.
4. Shape the sail using the outhaul and downhaul lines.

## how to reef a hobie 12

1. Release the outhaul and downhaul lines.
2. Secure the forward reef point into the gooseneck shackle.
3. Run the outhaul line through the aft reefing point.
4. Furl the sail and tie it at the remaining reef points (not to the boom).
5. Adjust the sail shape using the downhaul & outhaul lines.

## how to reef a hobie 16

1. Release the downhaul and lower the sail until the second halyard lock engages.
2. Secure the forward reef point into the gooseneck shackle.
3. Tie aft reef point to boom.
4. Roll the sail around the lowest batten and tie it against the boom when securing the three remaining reef points. NOTE:  $\frac{3}{16}$ " nylon line makes excellent reef ties. Allow enough line for two wraps around boom and furl sail. Do NOT tie tightly in the center three holes. Leave enough slack for the pocket of the sail to fill without ripping.

If four of you can't hold her down, and unless you are looking for a swim—it might be a good time to reef.

# The 2nd Annual (even crazier than the first!) Celebrity Sports Center High Altitude Indoor Hobie Sailing Regatta

We thought we'd seen the craziest regatta of them all when, back in January of 1976, 72 seemingly normal citizens of Denver, Colorado, painted their bodies, donned laced bloomers and frilly hats, and, generally, made spectacles of themselves as they spent an entire day frantically sailing Hobie 10's back and forth in the indoor swimming pool of the Celebrity Sports Center, one of Denver's most prestigious resort recreational centers. But on February 5 & 6, 1977, the Mile High City came unglued again, and this time TWICE as many people participated in what has to be the most unusual winter sports event ever held—THE SECOND ANNUAL CELEBRITY SPORTS CENTER HIGH ALTITUDE INDOOR HOBIE SAILING REGATTA!

Thousands of spectators flooded the bleachers surrounding the Celebrity Sports Center's large, Olympic-size swimming pool and watched in amazement as 48 teams (144 "sailors") representing restaurants, the media, and other businesses and organizations in the Denver Metro area, dressed (unabashedly!) in the most bizarre sailing attire imaginable and competed against each other in Hobie 10's provided once again by the folks at Rocky Mountain Marine. Large fans, courtesy of Super Vacuum Manufacturing Co., Central Bowling Service and the Glendale Fire Department, provided a good, steady wind for each leg of the three-leg course. KLAQ Radio personalities, Bob Lee and Peter Boyles, added their exciting commentary, humor and color to the unique event, and special guest, Hobie Alter, flew up from California to view firsthand this display of erratic behavior and present the awards to the winning teams.

The relay races began with a push start for the first sailor who raced one lap around the course, back to the exchange area where the second sailor took over, raced lap number two, then passed the boat off to the final sailor who completed the race. With six boats in each race, the 48 teams completed 16 races on Saturday, receiving points based on their position at the finish line. The 24 teams with the lowest total points qualified for the Sunday races that started with the Quarter Finals. ## RUDDER BLADE REPLACEMENT FOR THE HOBIE 14 & 16

It is almost impossible to hold tight tolerance on any castings, so Coast Catamaran assembles and fits each rudder blade assembly individually. Therefore, replacement rudder blades are not interchangeable. It is necessary to use the top half of the broken rudder blade as a template.

### To replace a broken rudder blade:

- 1) Remove the broken rudder blade assembly.
- 2) Remove the broken portion of the blade.
- 3) Place the broken rudder blade over the replacement blade. (Lexan blade for Hobie 16, and ABS rudder blade for Hobie 14.)
- 4) Insert the bolt from the lower casting through the lower casting hole in the broken rudder blade and then through the predrilled hole in the replacement blade.
- 5) Line up the edges of both blades and drill the upper casting hole in the replacement blade in the same position as on the old blade.
- 6) Reassemble the rudder assembly and install on the boat. NOTE: "ABS" REPLACEMENT RUDDER BLADES INSTALLED ON A HOBIE 16 ARE NOT COVERED UNDER WARRANTY. ON 16's, ONLY BLADES MADE OF "LEXAN" ARE COVERED UNDER WARRANTY.

## HOBIE FORUM

### HAMS AND HOBIES, HAND IN HAND



We have read with interest various articles in the Hot Line extolling the trials and tribulations of the Race Committee. Admittedly it can be exasperating and a hair-raising hassle, to say the least—those people serving on such race committees are really unsung heroes often dodging bargers and verbal abuses. We of Fleet 120 have been most fortunate since our first regatta three years ago to have the help and encouragement of members of the Panama City Amateur Radio Club, W4RYZ. Several members of the Ham Club serve on the committee boat and on shore during regattas. They transmit from committee boat to shore all the positions as boats finish and any protest information, enabling the shore committee to work on scoring immediately; often racers can get an idea of their positions by the time they land on shore.

We also have phone patch equipment available by means of the local Panama City Repeater, WR4 ALU, so that local calls, emergency or otherwise, can immediately be made from the race site. Families of these ham operators get into the act also—as race committee helpers, chase boat operators, drink boat throwers, and emergency crews.

Perhaps other Hobie Fleets could contact local amateurs in their own cities. These clubs might jump at the chance to help out with communications during regattas. Another thought if amateurs aren't close at hand, is to find a CB club that may be willing. Ham frequencies are quiet and uncrowded, and Citizens Band now abounds throughout the U.S. and is an effective way to communicate, especially across the water. Look into it—it may make the Race Committee's work a little easier. It sure has for us!

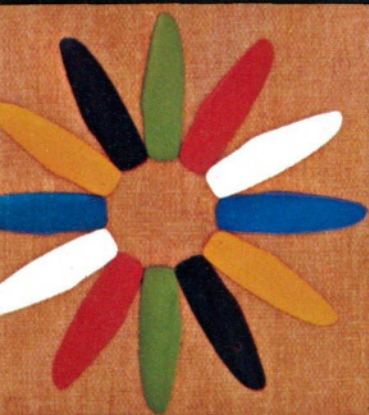
