## NATIONALS FORMAT: REBUTTAL

Dear Ed:

Much as I enjoyed some of Larry Cooke's letter to the Hot Line, his proposal to cut the number of prequalified skippers in the Nationals from 96 to 58 strikes me as an uncharacteristic screw-up.

Qualifying for the Nationals is, by now, one of the major life goals for thousands of Hobie skippers. Prequalifying for, and running, the 1975 Nationals is one of my fondest memories and will be a source of great pride to me until I pass on to the Great Regatta in the Sky (or, perhaps, do the Big Pitchpole). Reducing the hope of prequalification for those thousands of skippers who tramp around the country running points races would be a serious mistake. It would badly undermine attendance at these regattas and the whole Class Association racing program.

Even if it were implemented, Larry's idea wouldn't solve the problem that upsets him. He complains that up to 40% of prequalified skippers have passed up National Championship events. But he fails to realize that cutting the number of prequalification slots won't cut the percentage. If the number of slots were cut to 58, we might anticipate a Nationals with only 30 or so prequalified skippers. Compared to past Nationals, future Nationals could easily become minor league events.

The percentage of no-shows can be cut by the Class Association by requiring that prequalifiers respond to their invitation letters within ten days of receipt so that alternates can be invited soon enough to allow them to make plans to attend. One of our division's slots went unfilled at Fort Lauderdale because the first alternate—an excellent competitor—didn't get his invitation until a week before the Nationals!



Moving all three Nationals back to November would help too. It would allow points regattas to be run through the entire summer—a great improvement over the present practice of cramming them all into the first two-thirds of the season, and also give the Association more time to assemble its field. The Worlds could be pushed back to January when there's not much else going on anyway.

Larry's complaint about short races sounds valid, but the problem can be handled in any of several other ways:

- Increase the number of factory boats on hand from 48 to 96 and run simultaneous 48-boat races as in pre-1976 Nationals.
- Lengthen the Nationals by a day or two.
- 3) Scrap the round-robin concept for the Nationals (but not for the Worlds). This is my favorite. It's a lot more fun to be able to identify your competitors by sail number than to race against a half-anonymous field. It also allows you to study tuning techniques being used in various parts of the country with competitors from various areas. Most important, since everyone will have brought his own boat, it gets the race committee out of the business of evaluating the legitimacy of reported equipment failures, a problem bound to pop up in a field composed of untested, new boats. Boat preparation (by skippers) should be as much a part of successful racing in the Nationals as it is in points races. If the Class Association wants to preserve the photogenic quality of the Nationals, that can be accomplished by furnishing skippers with special sails to put on their own boats. Sails don't often break, but entire boats are apt to.

While many of Larry's ideas are impressive, cutting the number of prequalifying slots would undermine morale of skippers competing for them from around the country, cut attendance at points regattas, and do nothing to improve the quality of the Nationals fields. If the average Hobie skipper begins to suspect that the Class Association has become disinterested in his ambitions, he is likely to lose interest in the Association's program. And that, we can do without.

#### I WHAT?? MORE RUDDER STUFF

Dear Ed

You DOUBLE blew it!! Reference: Article regarding rudder rake measurements, March-April issue, 1978. I believe one should first look at why rudder rake is important. To simplify-on a Hobie or any asymmetrical-hulled catamaran, the rudders become an important factor for lift (ability to go to weather). The rudders actually, in part, take the place of centerboards found on symmetrical hulls. For a given rudder (stock or custom) there will be numerous settings of rake if all factors are considered. First, each skipper desires a certain helm pressure (heavy or light, weather or lee, even neutral). Each of these helm pressures requires a different rudder rake setting. Mast rake and sail shape also are critical when considering helm pressure. Raking the mast aft will increase helm pressure and thereby require the changing of rudder rake for the helm pressure desired. Moving the draft curvature (sail pocket) fore or aft or just opening the jib/main slot will also change helm pressure. Minute, but just as important, crew and skipper movement or balance changes helm pressure.

In essence, whatever method is used to determine rake should be used as a reference only. The article indicates specific dimensions work for both 14' and 16' Hobies—this is just not so! I believe you should stress that these are REFERENCE DIMENSIONS ONLY—approximate settings to work from. For example, on my boat the dimension I used varies ¼" from one rudder to the other, but my helm pressure and boat balance on each tack is the way I want it. This was achieved and can only be achieved by trial and error.

By the way, a good way to adjust rudder rake without continual epoxying and redrilling is to install (now Class legal) a rudder rake adjuster system (by Cooke Marine).

Due to lack of space we were not able to reprint the entire Rudder/ Weather Helm article (September/ October '77) along with the newer suggested measurements presented in the March/April '78 issue. The original article explains, just as you have here (and you are totally right) that the measurements are intended as reference points and that rudder adjustment is only part of an overall tuning which includes sail shape, mast rake, and other factors. We did not mean to imply that the distances are a fixed cure-all (if only it could be so easy) but rather represent what we feel are helpful research findings to put the boat owner in the ballpark. For your time and help, I'm going to let you get away with the free plug!

#### **FURTHER PERVERSITY**

Dear Ed:

Having just obtained new glasses the day before my "Hot Line" arrived, I know the manuscript I sent you for the March/April issue about trailers was not as well written as the one you printed! The changes you made in order to fit the article into the available space were improvements over my version (such as shortening it...). There are, however, two passages that I think should be changed.

First, the first sentence: While Finagle's Law, as you printed it, may well be an accurate reflection of my feelings about the American system of higher education, it is, nonetheless, a misquote. Finagle's Law should properly read: "The perversity of the universe

"The perversity of the universe tends to the maximum." I suggest we use this typographical error as an example of Finagle's Law in action. Second, on page 12, you have me

saying that the three-point tie-down system is improper. I personally don't like the method but many Hobie dealers consider it the proper way to tie down a boat and they teach it to their new Hobie owners. I think that the three-point system would be acceptable if the trailer were properly designed. First, the front trailer crossmember has to be strong enough to keep the winch rope from bending the frame-usually a second cross beam on the trailer is sufficient. Second, there should be vertical rollers or pads positioned to keep the boat from bouncing sideways off the trailer supports.

Any Hobie dealer who is actively involved in supporting its local fleet undoubtedly is aware of how Hobie owners in that area use their

# Midwinters West / Baja California

# NATIONAL QUALIFYING SYSTEM

The 1978 Qualifying System has five major changes. First, the 16 Nationals will have 80 teams instead of 96 like last year. Second, the 14 Nationals will have 72 entrants. Third, the number of alloted spots for each Division will be in direct proportion to that Division's attendance at past Nationals. Fourth, there will be six "floating" qualifying spots that the Hobie Class Association will disperse at their discretion to the Division hosting the Nationals and to surrounding Divisions. Finally, past National Champions will be prequalified for all future Nationals in the class in which they won their championship.

To ascertain the proportional allotments described in the third point, we recorded each Division's attendance at the past eight National Championships and determined an average percentage for each. Based on the number of entrants planned for the 1978 Nationals, each Division was granted their respective percentage of openings. The Hobie Class Association extensively reviewed past records to arrive at a fair breakdown. Several spots were taken from Divisions 2 and 8 (even though their percentages called for them) and were reassigned so that every Division (except 13) had no less than two openings. These allotments will be reviewed frequently and adjusted in future years, if necessary.

As in the past, skippers may earn points in any Division; however, points must remain in the Division in which they are earned. A skipper may qualify from any Division in which he has the necessary points but to qualify by winning a Divisional Championship you must be competing in the Division of your residence. If a Division holds five points

regattas, you may count your best three for 1978 points; if they hold six or seven points regattas, your best four will count; if they hold eight or nine, your best five will count; and if they hold ten, your best six will count. If a person is both a points qualifier and a Divisional Championship qualifier, he will be considered the Divisional Championship qualifier, and the next person in line in points standings will earn his points qualifier spot. Each of the six Area Championships will automatically prequalify the first place 14A and 16A skippers for the Nationals.

NOTE: It is important that race results be sent to the Hobie Class Association within one week of the event. Only complete results will be accepted and failure to comply may result in disqualification of the event as a points regatta.

# THIS MISS IS DYNAMITE

I'd like to introduce you to 95 pounds of dynamite.

During last Saturday's blustery opening of the Southwest Florida Hobie Cat Championship regatta, a blue and white blur caught my eye. It was a Hobie 14 flying across the water trailing a fog of froth and spray.

Winds were whistling out of the east at nearly 20 knots. Mother Nature was feeling a bit mischievous as she sent gusty winds and an unruly Caloosahatchee chop at the 47 participating catamarans. Boats were pitchpoling, capsizing, and somersaulting across the water. Needless to say, patrol boats and crews were kept busy.

I turned and remarked about the speed of this blue and white Hobie to Race Committee Chairman Paul Taylor. "That's Jennifer Hussey," he said. "She can really make that boat move."

When many 15-year-old girls are indoors baking cookies, watching TV, or practicing the latest version of the funky chicken, Jennifer Hussey is probably out jogging a couple miles or improving her sailing skills. Jennifer, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jerry Hussey of Fort Myers, is one of the few youngsters and rare young ladies who sails competitively in Southwest Florida. For some unknown reason, local sailing clubs are finding youth sailing activities slow to gain popularity. In last weekend's Hobie Cat championships, Jennifer was the only 15-year-old and female skipper competing against 47 sailors representing all parts of the state. After one capsize and a dunking in the river, Jennifer went on to a third place finish in the five-race series.

"I consider myself a very competitive person," she said. "I enjoy tennis, running for the Fort Myers High School cross country team, and sailing.

"I've been sailing since I was eight years old," Jennifer added. "I enjoy competition and find it challenging and most of all, lots of fun.

"My dad supported me a lot when I was little. At first I was scared of the water, but he was patient with me and kept me interested until I got over the fright.

"Sailing is a great sport, and I hope to keep sailing the rest of my life."

Tipping the scales at only 95 pounds, Jennifer has a bit of difficulty keeping her high performance Hobie right-side-up when it starts blowing hard. In Saturday's race, a big blast of wind caught Jennifer by surprise and flipped her into the drink. "I was getting pretty tired," she said. "I knew I had to keep the sails loose and slack off to keep from going over. When I flipped, my dad (aboard patrol craft) had to help me right the boat. I just don't weigh enough to right the boat myself." The dunking didn't dampen the enthusiasm and spirit of the young sailor. Clad in soggy foul-weather gear, Jennifer hopped back aboard her trampoline and continued sailing.

"I find sailing a real challenge," she said. "Every time I go out the wind and waves are different.

"I know many kids my age who enjoy sailing but few of them want to work at it so they can get good enough to race competitively. I enjoy racing against older sailors. It's a real challenge and when I beat someone more experienced than I, it's a great feeling."

Among Jennifer's list of sailing accomplishments is a third place in the National Midwinters East held in Sarasota in 1977.

"Sometimes I go sailing on weekends just to get out," she said. "I relax and enjoy the wind and waves. I have developed a confidence in my ability and don't get scared any more."

As I was perched atop Emie Finger's beautiful houseboat "Rock," the committee boat, I commented to Taylor that in a few years that little gal could be unbeatable around this area if she sticks with it.

"You can't let that pretty little smile fool you," commented Taylor, a well-respected one-design sailor. "If she has conditions her way, Jennifer can be as quick and dangerous as a rattlesnake."



# Austrailian Hobie Cat 14 and 16 Championships and Hobie Cat 16 World's Team Selection Series Frankston Yacht Club, Victoria Australia

Evel Knievel missed his big chance in 1977. He should have attempted to complete the first heat of the Australian Hobie Championships to show what he is made of. The deceptively heavy seas that had built up over the previous day or two and the treacherous 60 knot wind gusts, played havoc with the competitors.

Had we known that the first heat would be such a melee and that only 26 of the 145 entrants would be able to finish, we might not have had so many competitors willing to travel up to 2,500 miles to compete.


We almost had no championships at all! At a late stage in preparations the titles were in jeopardy due to the fact that we could not gain exemption from an AYF ruling prohibiting advertising on sails and boats. As a number of N.S.W. boats are sponsored (Mr. Wrangler, John Sands games, Amco Peaches, etc.) they could not have competed, or the series could not be held at an AYF affiliated Club. In Victoria, the Hobie Cat Class has grown mainly through its affiliated clubs and if the class is to continue to expand and operate as effectively as it has, then it needs to comply with AYF rules. However, the problem was averted when the sponsored boats agreed to change their sails and obliterate the adver-

tising slogans. A useful solution this time, but if the practice of sponsored boats spreads, and we hope it will, then a solution must be found before the problem arises a second time.

As it turned out, the 77/78 Australian Nationals attracted the most competent and experienced group of Hobie skippers ever assembled for a single regatta in Australia. This meant the competition would be keen and with the Hobie 16 Worlds team selection chance being offered, the 16 class competition was particularly fierce.

It is fair to say that in the past the Australian Hobie scene (and Worlds' teams) have been dominated by NSW skippers. However, that seems to have changed with the rapid growth of Hobie Catting in the past two years in Victoria and Western Australia. The Western Australian contingent achieved phenomenal results considering their small numbers. In the Hobie 14 class they took four of the first five places and it took a skipper of the calibre of Kerli Corlett (NSW 1977 titleholder) to stop the likes of Phil Smyth, Mal McKercher, Dave Lumpus, and Barry Sanders from making a clean sweep of the placings.

In the Hobie 16 class Bill Sykes/lan Burns of NSW won by a well-judged ¾ of a point from WA's Jim and Graeme

Internal boom vang? Squared-off transoms instead of the existing radius? Claiming your halyard is your righting line? Are these practices legal?

NO! These were just a few of the modifications noted at a recent regatta. All three violations received DSQ C's.

Our Class Rules have made an attempt to keep Hobie Cats as one-design as possible while still allowing some basic changes necessary to our growth. With the continuing evolution in sail rigging and hardware each year, ideas change on what makes Hobies go fastest. We all want to go faster but modifications must be kept under control.

Here's a quote from the Hobie Class Rules that shoud be your guideline when considering any changes or questionable practices:

"If you think you have found a loophole, take a look at the 'intent and object' clause. This covers most areas not covered in the rules. Generally, if you cannot find it listed in the rules, it's not class legal. But if you're in doubt, check with the Hobie Class Association first. Approval must be in writing."

If you follow this guideline, you won't find yourself before the Protest Committee defending your latest modification without any support.

The Hobie Class Association officers each year review the rule changes and modifications that you—the owners—have suggested. If you wish to make a change or addition to your boat that you do not find specifically designated as class legal in the rules, write to the Class Association for approval before you effect the change. If you wish to submit a suggestion for a new rule or a modification for review, send them to the Hobie Class Association, P.O. Box C-19509, Irvine, California 92713. Remember, it's your Class and you do have a voice. But until your innovation has been approved, keep it in the hardware box.

Cutts. Bill and lan together with NSW teammates Frank Milner/Keith Logan, and Geoff Horsley/Bob Forbes put up a tremendous battle for top placings. The seven skippers gaining automatic selection for the Hobie 16 Worlds include three from NSW, two from Victoria, and one each from Western Australia and the Australian Capital Territory.

The social events were well organized and most successful. A "meet the fleet" barbecue was held on the eve of the first heat after an invitation race. We wanted to call it a "Meat the Fleat" barbeque but weren't sure everybody wouldn't have thort we couldn't spel.

The weather had been kind to us that day, but a few short hours later (4:00 am) Tomm Vigushin was called out of his warm bed to round up a team of helpers out of their equally warm beds to rescue a number of Hobies being washed from the beach by the approaching storms. The skippers that placed their Hobies in the front position for an early start next day paid the penalty of having to rescue their boats or find them moved 400 meters down the beach overnight when the weather turned sour.

A disco dance was held one evening and was certainly a highlight of the week's activities. Would you believe most people spent a considerable part of their evening swapping sailing stories which grew less and less believable, and more and more humorous as the evening passed? Everyone, that is, except for Kerli Corlett. Kerli's main contribution (for which he was later crowned "King of the Kids") was to dance vigorously with the youngest of the Hobie supporters.

All good things though must come to an end and this memorable series was completed with the presentation of trophies. The Hobie Class National Sponsor for 1977/78 generously donated gift vouchers for 25 pairs of Wrangler Jeans and these were presented to various contributors to the Hobie Way of Life during the week. A great time was had by all as Michelle Gumley (NSW), Dianne Mellard (Vic), Sue Milner (NSW), Miviene McKercher (WA), Sandy Gillard (SA), Andrea MacDonald (Vic), Yvette Strawbridge (WA), Veronica Winterbourn (WA), Kerli Corlett (NSW), David Lumpus (WA), Roger Hellier (Vic), Norm Fitzgerald (NSW), Peter Johnson (NSW), Don Algie (ACT), Mike Wilkinson (ACT), Geoff Buchanan (Vic), Lyn Kriebig (ACT), Graeme Strawbridge (WA), Alan Critchley (Qld), John Pearce (Vic), and our everpopular Hobie dealer Bill Worrall (Vic) were awarded the novelty prizes.

The press and TV coverage of the Championships was really good; not only did we get plenty of pre-titles build-up, but we also scored a decent photograph and article in Garth Morrison's column "On a Yachting Tack" in the Herald. This was followed two days later with a center spread in the Sun complete with photographs galore. In addition, we were seen by millions of viewers in both the ABC and Channel 7 news on three occasions. This gave us better media coverage of the titles than any other class and may be regarded as another successful facet of the series.

One of our most notable participants was Melbourne's intrepid Lord Mayor, Cr. Irvin Rockman. Conditions were so heavy previous to the first heat that Cr. Rockman sailed past one of the official boats and asked where the start was minutes before it got underway. We also had one Hobie 16 female skipper, Dianne Mellard, who braved the strenuous conditions to participate.

Next year! Well there's always a next year isn't there, but due to the growth of the class, this may have been the last of its kind. The one thing that won't change of course is the Hobie Way of Life, the friendships, the stories, the "If only I hadn't's" that we can all participate in simply by becoming a Hobie Catter. We look forward to doing it all again at Jindabyne and Terrigal in 1978. Or should it be Burley Griffin and Middle Harbour?

All boats are 10-foot Hobie monohulls. And, get this, six boats are in the Celebrity Sports Center pool at the same time. Wind for the sailing craft is provided by 14 huge fans. The boats negotiate a triangular course marked by two buoys after an unorthodox start (naturally) by a push from one of the crewpersons.

So far, the regatta has produced no drownings or major shipwrecks even though most of the indoor sailors have never sailed before. According to a reliable source, sobriety isn't a handicap for regatta participants. One of the lowlights of the regatta is the contest for the most bizarre sailing costumes. Last year, a threesome showed up in chicken feathers (glued to their skivvies), one chap wore red underwear, and a trio of dandies was impeccable in yachting attire.

This year, more spectators than ever jammed Celebrity Sports Center's indoor lagoon to witness the third running of this "regatta," which once again lived up to its wacky reputation. Fifty teams, representing Denver's finest restaurants, businesses, and





# FOR THOSE WHO DARE!




Fleet 99 in Corpus Christi, Texas, is proclaiming August as their HOBIE month of the year.

For the past three years, Fleet 99 has sponsored an endurance regatta from Port Isabel, Texas, to Corpus Christi, Texas, called the Rough Riders Regatta. This regatta begins on Saturday morning and ends 140 water miles away in Corpus Christi on Sunday afternoon. In 1975, Fleet 99 was looking for a new adventure to undertake, so a few of the old salts came up with the idea for this regatta and since that month forward it has become a tradition every August to hold the Rough Riders Regatta.

The history of this regatta has been one of our best. The race begins at the bridge at Port Isabel, so that we can either sail through the open Gulf of Mexico or up the Inter-Coastal Canal. The regatta is broken into three races, each overseen by two chase boats which lead the way and give assistance when needed. An amazing point about each race is that the boats are on a screaming reach and there are no marks to round for 140 miles.

The Rough Riders Regatta of 1977 was an event that the participants will never forget. It began like most normal regattas... one individual drove 160 miles and forgot to pack his sails—after regaining consciousness, he was able to rent some sails and still make the trip. The red flag was scheduled for 9:30 am and it looked like it was going to be a cruise rather than a race with winds blowing at only 10 miles per





hour. However, we soon found that this was only the calm before the storm. Along about 11:00 am, the weather changed drastically due to the tropical wave in our area and the winds climbed to 30 mph. By the end of the first race, everyone was ready for a rest. As the participants relaxed and told of some earlier mishaps of the morning, the winds climbed to almost 40 mph. These people had come to race (even if they had wanted to cruise, it would have been impossible) and they were getting their money's worth as the boats literally flew through the water.

The Inter-Coastal Canal is almost completely isolated except for Red Fish Bay which marks the end of the second race. There the Hobies met with eight-foot swells which they sailed across at about 20 mph. One competitor was clocked by a fishing boat at 25 mph with his mainsheet out all the way. Halfway across the bay we lost one of our chase boats to a cross swell and it had to be towed to a nearby port. The other chase boat was busy helping right boats. Relief would be an understatement as to how each sailor felt as he reached the second finish line. Dinner was welcomed and well deserved. In fact, the Hobie Way of Life began to quickly emerge as the refreshments were guzzled down.

Late Saturday night the rains came and most sailors had to take refuge under their boats. By 10:00 Sunday morning, the rains had stopped and the sky began to clear which made for a beautiful traveling day to end the Rough

Riders Regatta. To my knowledge, only one Hobie 16 and one Hobie 18 made the trip without capsizing. Racers told stories of boats within 100 feet of them disappearing into enormous clouds of sand. Hobies were pitchpoling backward as they went into irons to rest. Around 2:00 pm the boats were nearing Corpus Christi Marker 59. As the local boats passed this point, they knew they'd made it home.


Of the 26 catamarans that began the regatta, Fleet 99 is proud to say that not one of the Hobies had to be towed to port. However, we can't say the same for the other brand catamarans that tried to make the trip.

In 1978, the Rough Riders Regatta is scheduled for August 19 and 20. We are anticipating a large turnout because the fame of this regatta has spread throughout our division. For a small entry fee, the skipper and crew get plenty of excitement, dinner and breakfast on a deserted island, and free refreshments. As mentioned earlier, two chase boats are close at hand to give assistance and carry supplies.

Fleet 99 is proud of our heritage. We look forward each year to the challenge of sailing our Hobies 140 miles and overcoming the perils of the unknown. If you think you have what it takes to sail in this kind of regatta, write to Fleet 99, 4518 Greensboro, Corpus Christi, Texas 78413.



commandments should be as well known to you as the original ten.

 A vessel on starboard tack has rightof-way over one on port tack.

A boat to windward (closer to the source of the wind) must give way to a leeward boat.
 A boat that is overtaking another from

astern must avoid the vessel it is overtaking. In the environment of the sea, goodwill and common sense should prevail between sailors;

common sense should prevail between sailors; this sets the basis for the next (I feel most important) rule.

 Thou shall not allow collision to occur between your boat and any other.

These rules are needed in most instances, not just racing. But use some common sense, do not yell "Starboard" at a tanker or freighter [NOTE: These are not boats but ships.] and expect to get right-of-way. I can tell you from experience it doesn't work. One last thing, watch out for the other guy! "I didn't see you," isn't a very good excuse for making his catamaran into a monohull or reducing the length of your own boat by a foot or two. Remember, sailing is supposed to be fun and a way to escape the busy, crazy, wreck-prone streets of the city. Let's try to keep it that way.

## FLEET 221 Richmond, Virginia

Beginners' Tips offered in Newsletter:

Very often new Hobie sailors would really like to try racing but don't for fear of being embarrassed. This fear can be alleviated with knowledge. New sailors simply don't always know what they're supposed to do or how to do it... so, we're going to try to explain some of the basics.

The typical race course is triangular. You normally sail the first leg into the wind; the second leg with the wind coming from the side (beam); and the third leg with the wind coming from behind. Start-finish lines and the number of laps are set before the race by the race committee. Usually, the leg most beginners have trouble with is the first or windward leg. This is the leg where you head for a mark directly into the wind. We already know that you cannot sail directly into the wind, so how do you get to the first mark? Consider the center line of your boat as an axis (a line in the center running from bow to stern and parallel to both hulls). First determine where the wind is coming from, then line up the axis of your boat so that an imaginary arrow showing the wind direction and your boat axis form an angle of about 45 degrees. You should normally be able to sail about half the leg on one tack. Then, finish up on one more tack, and then round the mark. Pinching is to be avoided at all costs! This means sailing at an angle of less than 45 degrees. When you pinch you lose speed even though you travel a shorter total distance. Watch those tell-tails!

#### FLEET 95 Seattle, Washington

A word of advice from Commodore Stan Butchart:

FOR NEW RACERS... Don't be discouraged by light winds; there is a lot to be learned from them. The important thing in handling light, fluky winds is to spend 60 seconds of each minute determining the wind direction. It requires a good deal of interpretation of what one sees over the full height of the sail. You will need a full complement of wind indicators to do it.

#### FLEET 126 Michigan City, Indiana

Fleet 126 has several "Big Events" planned for summer 1978. On July 15, the "Across the Lake" race from Michigan City to Wilmette will be run. On July 29-30, we will host the Division 10 Championships, a first ever for Michigan City. The new launching ramp, which will be constructed in close cooperation with the city government, the port authority, and the park department, will be a permanent contribution to small boat sailing in Michigan City.

The week of August 12-19, Fleet 126 will sponsor the Second Annual Michigan City to Mackinac Island Hobie Race. The "Mac II" is a daylight sailing event for Hobie 16s only, with full camping gear carried on board. A primary and a nearer secondary port will be chosen before each morning's sail, and the distance to be sailed will be determined by current weather information and conditions. The winner will be determined by minimum total elapsed time. The "Across the Lake" and the "Mac II" races are open to experienced sailors only and all competitors must comply with strict standards of safety, equipment, and preparedness. The number of entries will be limited.

The fleet's season was to have started January 28 but impossible travel conditions forced a delay. The initial meeting of 80 Hobie enthusiasts was held a month later at the Michigan City Yacht Club. Our program for the season was outlined, and three instructional films on basic sailing skills were shown. Our fleet has grown from 15 Hobies last season to over 30 at present, with realistic prospects of 50 boats for the 1978 season. We have instructional programs scheduled monthly up to and including the shake-down race in late May.

We have ten series races scheduled through the summer, the best five of which count toward the season's trophies. Additionally, on the Sunday of of the three holiday week-ends, we will have a family picnic outing on the beach with three-man, four-man, ladies skipper races, hull-flying contests and the like. The season will conclude in September with our Sea Scout Appreciation Day-our way of expressing our gratitude to the Sea Scouts who man our committee boat during the series races.

Fleet 126 has planned a full summer schedule with a good balance of instruction, family fun, and racing competition. We extend an invitation to all Hobie sailors in our area to come join us. # ASSOCIATION: FOREIGN REPORT

#### Fleet 159 — Winnipeg, Manitoba, Canada

We are proud to announce that we are the largest catamaran class in the province of Manitoba and this year should see us become the largest class covering all sail craft. The highlights of last year's sailing season were the Manitoba Multihull Championships and our Provincial Hobie Cat Championships.

The Manitoba Multihull Championships were held on Lake Winnipeg, a body of water covering over 500 miles in length. The Solcat 18 Canadian National Championships were held in conjunction with this event and our local fleet found themselves sailing against the larger Solcats from as far as British Columbia. The competition was close; however, a Hobie Cat 16 took the event, winning handsomely in three out of four races. To say the least, we were very happy to trounce our competition in their Canadian Championships.

More close competition prevailed at our Provincial Championships where a scant ¾ of a point separated the three top Hobie Cat 16 crews. The final winners of the Hobie Cat 16 trophies were the team of Glen and Louise Sampson from Winnipeg; second place went to the team of Brian and Colleen Lewis of Steinbach; and third place went to Paul and Percilia Gray of Winnipeg.

Competition was as keen in the 14 class. Only 1% points separated the top three skippers—first place Frank Nowicki of Winnipeg, second place Glen Smallwood of Winnipeg, and third place Fred Hopilolis of Winnipeg.

#### Victoria, Australia

Steve Hickford recently became the Victorian Multihull Committee's delegate to the Victorian Yachting Council. This is another "first" for Hobies, being the first time in Australia that a representative from the ranks of the "production cats" has held such a position on a State's governing yachting body. The post also involves Steve in representing Victorian Multihulls at the Australian Yachting Federation's Multihull Committee Annual General Meeting in Sydney. More proof of the acceptance and recognition of "plastic" boats as a serious class of sailors!

#### Laguna Hobie Cat 16 Regatta on Saipan

#### (by Lorie Eichner)

The Third Annual Laguna Regatta held on the Northern Marianas Island of Saipan turned into an international event for the first time since its inception in 1976 as participants from Hawaii, Majuro, Guam, Saipan, and the U.S. mainland entered.

Herb Andresen of Hawaii took the Brass Bat trophy away from the previous two years' winners—the Chuck's Steak, House team of Warren McGillavry and Jac Garrett of Guam (who only managed an eighth place in the final winnertake-all race). The three-day four-race event was conducted on Hobie 16s in the crystal clear waters off the Saipan Intercontinental Hotel beach.

A total of 18 teams particiated in the event that saw Andresen and his niece Michelle Bowen (crew) take first in their two qualifying races on Saturday and Sunday. Bob and Bea Heron of Guam took first place in their respective heats but these two hot teams did not face each other until the final showdown on Monday.

The Herons won the hull-fly (the first fun event in the Over the Reef Yacht Club-sponsored regatta) by keeping their hull out of the water for one minute and 26 seconds. Bill and Jeanie Sakovich of Saipan were second in that qualifying event with 1:06. Finishing with only one second less were Gil Niday of San Diego, California, and Marbie Yamasaki of Guam. Winds were light at 5-8 knots, giving sailors barely enough wind to lift their hulls.

Slattebo, representing the Marshall Islands Yacht Club, and his crew Jerry Kosiro of Saipan, took second place in both qualifying races in their respective heats, and the Sakoviches were second in both races of their heats in spite of capsizing in the first event.

The first day's races were conducted in steady, moderate winds and the seas were smooth. The second day's races were conducted in varying winds, ranging from 0-10 knots due to squalls. Because temperatures on the tropical island vary little, the balmy 82-85 degree readings and almost steady sunshine make sailing a year-round sport.

The top ten qualifiers, determined by an accumulation of points earned in the hull-fly

and two heats, sailed in the final competition for the Brass Bat award Monday.

A fun rally which did not count toward qualifying for the final event was held Sunday afternoon. This event tested not only the sailing skills of the competitors, but also their skills at other diverse activities such as learning to say Carolinian phrases, weaving headbands (marmars), retrieving rocks from the ocean floor and husking coconuts. All this had to be accomplished before sailors could sail back to their original starting point to win the event. First to finish was the team of Bill and Jeannie Sakovich of Saipan and Chuck Phelan and Jane Faria of San Diego. In second place were Dean and Betsy Robb of Saipan and Steve and Lorie Eichner of Guam, followed by Andresen and Bowen of Hawaii and Ed and Janet Gratonik of Saipan.

The final contest for the Brass Bat was close between Andresen and Heron, both of whom sailed neck and neck for the first half of the 14-mile course. Then Andresen managed to outpoint Heron, sailing a shorter course around the marks. Slattebo was third throughout the race and Sakovich was fourth. John and Jan Eades of Guam capsized and turned turtle at the furthest ocean buoy three miles from shore, allowing Eichner to pass him. Shortly thereafter, Robb made a favorable tack and overtook Eichner to finish fifth. Eades made a trememdous comeback after righting his boat and passed Eichner on the final leg. trailers and has already made these or similar modifications to the trailers they sell. Furthermore, trailer manufacturers are usually receptive to user feedback and will include needed design changes as a matter of course. Unfortunately, there are still a number of trailers running around that were built before this problem became evident. For those trailers, the three-point tie-down system is improper unless modifications are made to strengthen the trailer.







June 24 - 25/Steamboat Lake Marina




Now you can rebuild those worn down bottoms and be confident that they will be class legal. We suggest you glue this actual size diagram (matched to the model of your Hobie Cat-14 or 16) to a piece of 1/4" plywood, then cut along the outline with a jigsaw. Now you have a permanent template that can be used when rebuilding your hulls or for checking the amount of wear those drags along the beach have caused.

The measurements given are of a cross section from the underside of the hull lip to the bottom of the hull at the point marked "C" in the accompanying sketch. The dimensions should be maintained precisely when rebuilding so that the exact hull shape can be achieved. Good luck!




