More on Hobie 17 Weight Controversy

I'd like to comment on the new Hobie 17 Weight Classification Ruling. I bought one of the first 17s in my area and have raced it for two seasons in both Division 6 and 14. I have also served as an officer in my Division and on Race Committees.

The Light/Heavy System puts an extra burden on Regatta Hosting Fleets. In an area where we go 5-deep per class in trophies, this system would mandate having 11 trophies ready for 17A (5-Light, 5-Heavy and 1-Overall), instead of the 5 we now have ready. Worse yet, this practically eliminates the possibility of a B Fleet.

The 17 class doesn't seem to be growing. In Division 6, the 17 class is shrinking. The less experienced sailors are being blown away by more experienced sailors, are getting discouraged, and quit attending Regattas. At the two Regattas which "advertised" a 17B Fleet (Fort Worth and Oklahoma City), several new sailors raced but don't like the intensity of A Fleet. Coast Cat needs to promote the 17 to less experienced sailors if they want the class to grow. Of the Hobie 17 owners I have polled, 100 % believe the class would benefit more by a B Fleet than by a Light/Heavy Class System, if given a choice.

To substantiate my claim, you might poll non-executive Hobie 17 owners who sail it every week, not one week a year. Or, take a hint from your previous experience with the 14 Turbos. Two weight classes don't work!

I love my Hobie, and want the 17 class to grow. I hope you feel the same.

Polar Passage Update

Here's the latest on the great adventure of Jeff MacInnis and crew—those invincible Hobie sailors who for three summers in a row are challenging a part of the Northwest Passage through Canada's Arctic in their invincible Hobie 18.

The second of three expeditions was successfully completed in the summer of '87 despite heavy ice conditions. In 38 days they sailed what is historically the most difficult 1,000 miles of the Northwest Passage from Cambridge Bay to Cape Anne in Barrow Strait.

"We're determined to finish the last 400 miles in the summer of '88," said Jeff. "We believe, and I think we've proven, that other than an icebreaker, a Hobie Cat is the best vessel to travel the ice-choked waters of the Northwest Passage. Your boat is incredible."

Thanks, Jeff. We think so too. Congratulations on your incredible success, and best wishes for your next one in 1988.

HOBIE HOT TIP

A Constructive Solution to Hobie 16 Mast Chip Creep

I'm writing in reference to your "Ask The Expert" column, page 25, November/December 1987, on Hobie 16 mast chip creep.

I own a 1984 Hobie 16 and I, too, have gone through enough

mast chips to keep the local Hobie dealer in business.

Being a general contractor by trade, and being constantly involved in construction problems and solutions, I decided to look into this problem. After considerable experimentation I have finally come up with a probable cause and simple solution.

As to the cause of the problem, it appears to me after some comparison that the Hobie 16 mast bases on the later models are machined differently than the older models, and in such a way that exacerbates the problem. Because of space considerations I will not elaborate here on my theory.

The way I have found to solve this problem is to take a standard mast chip and first beat it a little with a rough hammer to soften the chip and rough up the surface. Then I place the flat chip into the base and beat it down with the round end of a ball peen hammer to form it into the cup. Then I remove the chip and apply a small amount of construction adhesive such as Macco's Liquid Nails, or Scotty's Nail-it, into the base. Then I fit the formed chip into position and use a large C-clamp or some other device to hold the chip firmly in position for a couple days, allowing the adhesive to harden.

When I first tried this I did not expect the adhesive to stick to the teflon chip, but I've had the same mast chip in place for approximately eight months. After extensive use it won't budge and is still performing superbly.

Shall I Wrap It or...?

Okay, Hobie sailors – here's the issue of this issue. It's an important two-way question:

- 1. What do you expect from your local Hobie dealer?
- 2. What should that dealer expect from you?

Sometimes things get hot when I ask for the answers in a presentation that I often give to fleets. Hot or not, the answers from far-flung fleets and dealers across this nation are remarkably similar. The answers to What do you expect from your local dealer? usually include the following, not necessarily in the order of their importance:

- Good stocks of Hobie Cats.
- Functional repair parts, and plenty of em
- A wide range of accessories.
- Encyclopedic knowledge about products
- Sailing knowledge of Biblical proportions.
- Fair pricing the lower the better.
- Fleet discounts.
- Convenient hours—say, 6:00 a.m. to, oh, around Midnight?
- Service, and we mean service.
- A warm, wonderful, friendly, patient, helpful attitude.
- Use of the dealer's place for fleet meetings.
- Help at major events. Major help at major events.

Let's see. Have I overlooked anything? Maybe a 24-hour ship-to-shore hotline to the dealer? And a day care center at the dealer's where parents can park fleet orphans? And catered 5-Star gourmet banquets at the dock? And celebrity entertainers after all regattas? Oh, yes. The Beach Boys. Anything else? Oh, yes. The Moon!

Now, you fleet people can only be expected to expect the best. Otherwise you wouldn't be into Hobies in the first place, right? I mean, you got class, and that's what you want from your local dealer.

Your dealer, if he or she is worth his or her salt in sailing, must have class like you. The super-hotlines, child care and extravaganzas may be a bit beyond the dealer's means, but there should be no question about the Moon. Your dealer should be willing to give you the Moon.

The operative word is "willing". Whether the dealer is able is not the point. The dealer's profound desire to serve you is what matters. That desire turns words into actions, and promises into realities, for you.

Of course, your dealer expects something in return for all this—but not much, relatively speaking. Beyond money in exchange for merchandise, most dealers entertain these down-to-Earth expectations of you:

- Your understanding.
- Your patience.
- Your courtesy.
- Your fairness.
- Your lovalty.
- Your loyalty.
- Your lovalty.

As you can see, the operative word here is "loyalty." Assuming both you and your dealer believe in win-win, then loyalty is the wind that fills your sails.

For example, let's say your local dealer has truly earned your loyalty. But still, you owe it to yourself to compare prices. Maybe you discover in this very magazine a mail order dealer who sells the item you want for less. At first glance this may seem like a dilemma. Do you break the bonds of local dealer loyalty and pop your check in the mailbox? Or do you occasionally pay slightly more for the same item by going straight to your local dealer?

Now you can see why things get hot in the fleet talks that I mentioned. This is just one hot issue, and it deserves a careful look. Let's take that look with the clear understanding that local or not, all Hobie dealers are important to you, and to us. We're all in the Hobie game together.

The question of popping mail vs. popping local doors for parts and accessories is a major judgement call—and here are some considerations for your consideration.

The best way to prove your loyalty to your local dealer is to give him or her first crack at the sale. Go ahead. Make his or her day. If necessary, flash the competitive mail order price and say, "Face it. Here's their price. Are you gonna give me the Moon, or what?" Now, that's negotation!

Your local dealer may be *lower* in price than mailorder. Take it! Or, he may say

something like, "Look, pal, I'm here to give you the Moon, but not at a no-profit price. You gotta understand! That mail order dealer has advantages compared to me. For one thing, he doesn't have to help with your fleet business, with customer relations, with regattas, with service, with public relations or with community relations. For another, he doesn't have my kind of local overhead. He doesn't even have to maintain the same kind of service facility that I do. To make a long sea story short, the mail order dealer can sometimes sell for less because it costs him less to make a sale."

Well, we won't try to predict the final outcome of this theoretical negotiation, but we do know one thing for sure. Whether or not your local dealer matches or is lower in price as a result, you're both playing the right cards for an ongoing win-win relationship. You give your local dealer a chance to compete. Your local dealer also gets a few things off his chest. Meanwhile he/she sees your *loyalty* even if you wind up going elsewhere.

Now let's look at all this from the mail order dealer's perspective. I repeat, all Hobie dealers are important to you and to us—and they all enthusiastically support Hobie sailing. Yes, there's competition between them in this free enterprise system of ours. But the mail order dealer has a logical niche in those communities where there's no local dealer at all.

And here's another thing. We know of two mail order dealers who sell all of their items—both proprietary and open market—to local Hobie dealers at wholesale trade pricing so they can compete locally. Such companies have put more into our sport than they have taken out. For example, SSI invented the roller traveler on the Hobie 14, 16 and 17. And Murrays invented the ball and socket safety trapeze hookup for Hobie Cats.

So there you have a glimpse of just one aspect of the sailor/dealer relationship. I sincerely hope all my dealer friends will agree that I'm navigating this delicate course correctly. But if I've missed the boat, go ahead, dealers—make my day. Raise flags, shoot flares, send letters so we can all stay on the right tack.

Now let's move on to some other items on the list of things you expect from your

local dealer. I'll group these items under the category of "fleet business". They include fleet discounts, fleet meetings, help during major events, and the general fleet/dealer relationship.

The question of fleet discounts is easily answered when one realizes that the Hobie fleet is the major market for the Hobie dealer. This means that there's nothing to discount from, unless the dealer raises prices and then discounts them in order to get the margins needed to stay in business.

As a relatively small business enterprise, the dealer usually has limited capital that needs to be conserved and used where it will bring the highest return. These returns are not only monetary. They're also soul food. The mental nourishment that comes from doing good work for individuals and fleets. Thus, the enlightened local dealer will "fish where the fish are." This usually means strong dealer support of the fleet.

The dealer's best form of fleet support is constant friendship. It's a master key to the fleet's long life and vitality. Fleets, like any other group, have common problems and even conflicts between members. The dealer can be a calming, problem-solving influence because of local knowledge. The dealer knows the people, the history, the symptoms of problems, the causes of problems and often, some innovative solutions. Here again we're talking win-win. To both sailor and dealer, the benefits of a happy fleet are obvious.

Now, "constant friendship" doesn't mean that the dealer should become Fleet Commodore, Fleet Officer or Chief Slave. Only in extraordinary circumstances should the dealer serve as an executive. And never should he/she do all the work while sailors have all the fun.

That constant friendship must also be tempered by the dealer's sheer need to keep up with the press of daily dealer business. If he/she can't help with this year's points regatta, or open up late on Thursday night so you can get parts for a weekend trip, or has trouble offering facilities for fleet meetings—don't despair. Constant friendship should still be there. Constant friendship is the willingness—but not always the ability—to give you the whole Moon.

An Introduction to Kegaffas

Attention, new Hobie fanatics - funseekers! This will introduce you to the fascinating, challenging, exciting, action packed, wonderful wet world of - you guessed it — Hobie regattas. We hope to make your first regatta a fun experience and the first of many.

Sequence Of Events

1. Registration



A registration area will be set up somewhere at the regatta site so that arriving boats can take care of business and get into sailing. First, fill out an entry form. You'll need to know your sail number. You'll be


asked which fleet you will be sailing in: "A", "B", "C" or novice. As a novice racer (sailed less than three points regattas and not trophied), register in novice fleet where you'll be competing against less experienced skippers. (With increasing experience and skill, you'll move up through "C' fleet, "B" fleet and into "A" fleet.) At registration, you'll receive your "goodies": T-shirts, meal tickets, etc., (if applicable) and a written set of race instructions. These instructions contain information on the conduct of the races, schedule of races, special safety precautions and so forth. Read thoroughly before setting sail!

2. Boat Set-Up



Depending on the regatta site, assistance may be provided by sponsoring fleets. For example, there may be jeeps to haul your boat and trailer to the beach. But if access is reasonable, just pick a spot and go to it. (Check with the funny looking guy in the loud shorts and funny hat; there's always one.)

3. Skipper's Meeting



4. Sailing Out and Racing

As you sail out to the racing area, start looking for the Committee boat and head over to it. It usually will be found in the middle of all those other Hobies sitting over there. Also, keep an eye open for the marks—they're often hard to spot from the starting area. When you arrive at the starting area, locate the start/finish line. Look up-wind and try to spot "A" mark, or the weather pin, as it is called. This mark is often very far away and may be difficult or impossible to see. The area around the Committee boat is generally very congested, so watch those other boats.

If the wind shifts or if difficulty with the marks should delay the start, the Committee will fly a postponement flag once. Ready to start, the Committee sounds a signal (horn or gun) and raises a white flag. The first fleet starting will start exactly 10 minutes after this flag goes up. The white flag stays up for four minutes and then comes down. After one minute, the Committee sounds another signal and raises a blue flag. This stays up for another four minutes and then comes down. After one minute, a red flag goes up with another sound signal and the first fleet is off. Other fleets then start at five minute intervals while the red flag stays up for four minutes each time and comes down exactly one minute before each start. The Race Committee usually tries to hail any boat that is over the line early so it can return to restart, but it's the skipper's responsibility to start properly.

Although the rules for your race don't apply until five minutes before your start, it is a courtesy to stay well clear of boats starting so they can maneuver freely. A good place to watch from is above an extension of the starting line well off to either side. After the fleet in front of you has started, be sure to check the course number set on the Committee boat for your start as it may have changed. Conditions permitting, the Race Committee will conduct two or three races back to back, without breaks.

After racing, it's back to the shore, sails down, boats dragged out of harm's way, refreshments and war stories. Sunday morning it's back on the course for one or two more races.

After racing, the Committee packs up the marks and scores the races. Everyone gets to throw out their worst score if the regatta had more than three races, and the results are tabulated. A first place finish scores 3/4 points, second scores two points, third scores three points, etc. Low score wins. Trophies are handed out, to the admiration of all your peers, when the scoring and protests are finished.

More Things You Need to Know Before Your First Regatta

Your boat must be "class legal". Basically, you cannot modify your boat in any way that might offer an unfair speed advantage (custom made sails) or be unsafe (undersize wires). Items like wind indicators or

additional non-skid carpeting on the side rails are okay. Also, you must have the following: one Coast Guard-approved personal flotation device for each person on board (the Race Committee may require that these be worn while racing); one throwable flotation cushion for boats over 16'; one 14' or two 7' lines (min. 3/8" diameter) secured to the boat (righting lines); and a sounding device.

Since regattas are scheduled for wind and not warmth, adequate clothing is a must. A wetsuit is a great investment in comfort, especially if you capsize. Many companies make comfortable wetsuits just for sailing. These are a good deal because they can extend the sailing season several months. Gloves are also a good idea. A stopwatch is helpful to keep track of the starts. The best deal is a Casio water sport watch with a count-down timer. It's hard to miss a start with one of these.


And now a note about the racing rules that you can get from Hobie Cat or from your fleet. The rules are basically right of way rules to prevent collisions. For example, it happens often during a race that two or more skippers want to be in the same place at the same time. The rules spell out who prevails. A good book is "Paul Elvstrom Explains the Rules". Eventually you'll learn the rules by heart, but for starters these will do:

- 1. When boats are on opposite tacks, port tack boat stays clear.
- When boats are on the same tack, windward boat stays clear.
- Don't tack or jibe in front of others so they have to alter course to avoid you during your maneuver.
- 4. When a boat has an inside overlap on you at a mark, give it rounding room to round so it can avoid hitting the mark.
- 5. If you hit a mark, reround it.
- If you're not sure of something, avoid the situation and and ask questions on the beach later.

Depending on where you are on the course, there are exceptions to all of these rules. This is especially true near marks. Until you have all rules and exceptions down pat, just follow this rule of thumb: When in doubt, give people room, then ask questions of the guy with the red ribbon on the beach.

With these basic guidelines, you're ready to try your first regatta. And once you're there, you'll meet lots of friendly Hobie People who will give you all the help you need to understand the finer points of racing and perfect your skills on your way to "A" fleet. Good luck! See you at next year's Worlds!
